



Things to remember about your new kitty:

Vaccinations: Your cat or kitten has received age-appropriate basic vaccinations. The “basic” vaccination given by Cat Haven is a “4-in-1” or FVRCP. If your adopted kitty is less than 12 weeks old, it may not have received a rabies vaccination yet. **Any vaccinations not given prior to adoption are your responsibility to schedule and pay for at your veterinarian when due.**

New Kitty Health Concerns: Cat Haven will disclose any health concerns known to us that the kitty may have. However, if you notice anything that concerns you within the first 2 weeks of having the kitty home that may be surgery or shelter related, please reach out to Cat Haven. If it is shelter related, we will do whatever we can to help. Otherwise, we may advise you to schedule an appointment with your veterinarian.

Pet Insurance: You will find in your folder information on Companion Protect which is the pet insurance company that we partner with. Please consider signing up for this pet insurance as Veterinary bills can be costly.

Microchipping: Your cat/kitten has received a microchip implant. At the time of adoption, your pet is registered to Cat Haven. It is your responsibility to contact 24 Petwatch to have your new pet registered in your name. Information on how to do this will be provided to you at the time of adoption.

Rehoming your kitty: If you find that the cat you adopted is not a good fit for your family or that you are unable to care for your kitty, please remember that Cat Haven will happily take the kitty back into its adoption program. We will not think badly of you for returning your kitty, but we will think badly of you if we find the kitty at another shelter or posted on Craig’s list!
